- *Reduced 'rendering' speed (i.e., increased time to draw page)*

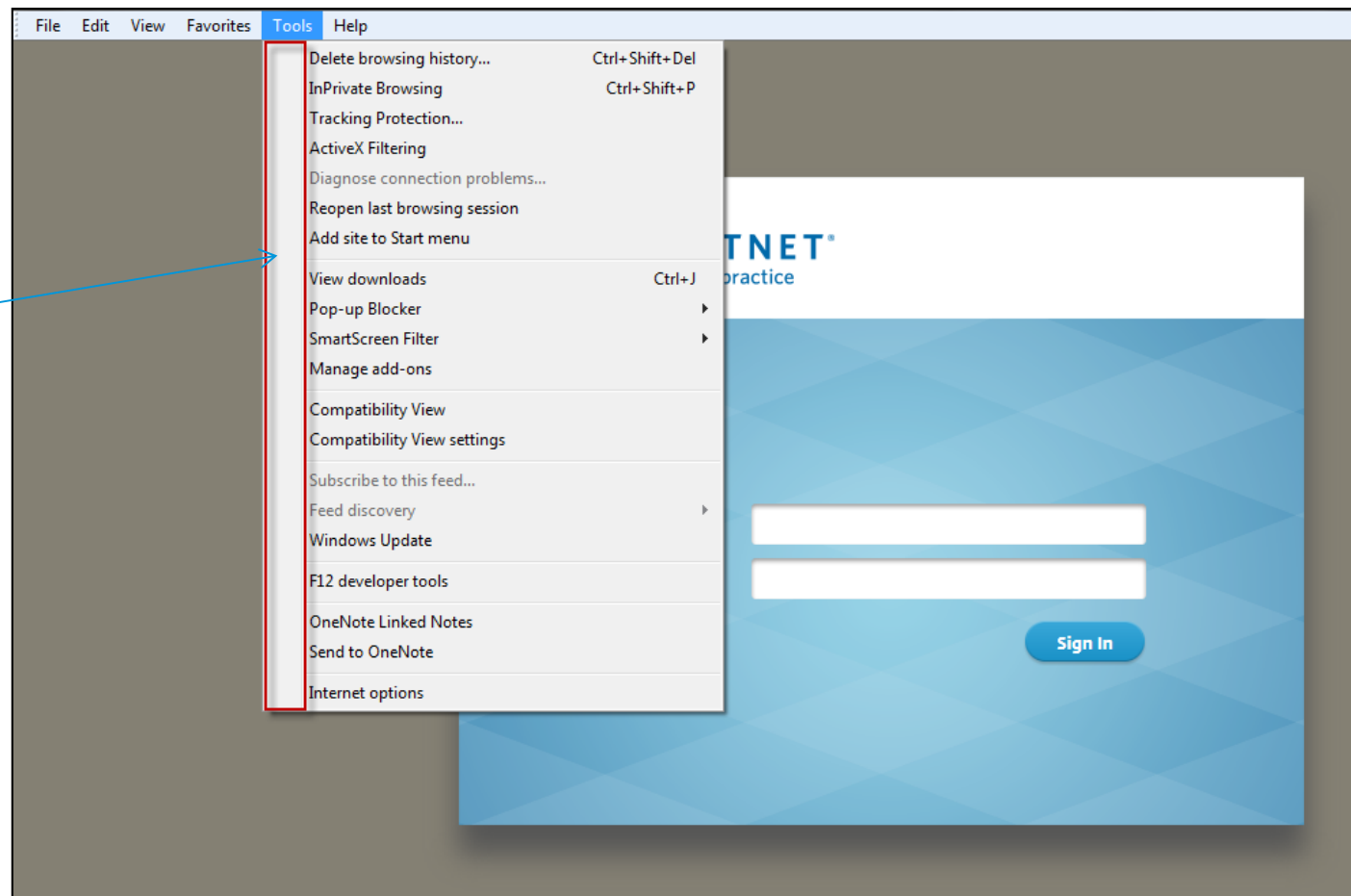


